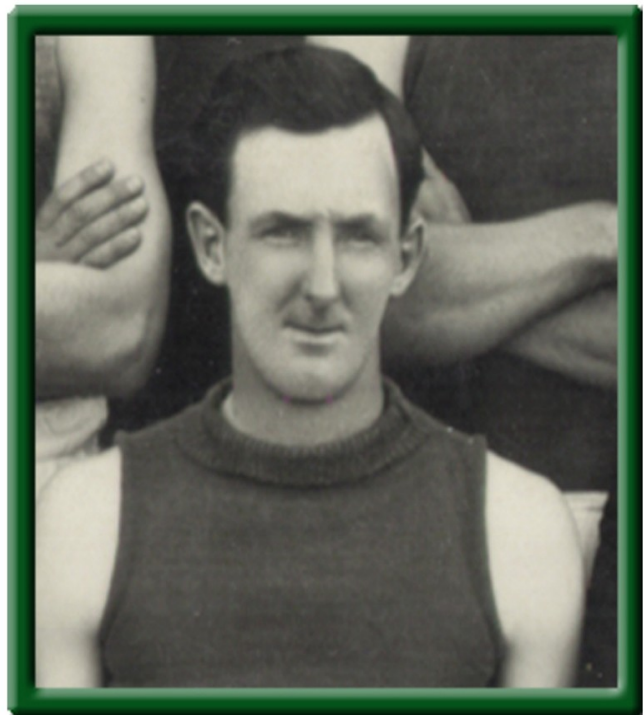
Martin Kearns – St. Mark's

Also known as 'Gil' he was considered one of the finest players of his era and played a significant role in establishing St. Mark's as a force in the Port Pirie Football League after the First World War.

He led the Green Team to three premierships, including the 1920 Grand Final when he kicked the only five goals St. Mark's scored for the match. Equal second longest serving captain for St. Mark's - Port.

A classy ruck rover or forward, who was rated among the best recruits ever picked up from Solomontown.
